FISCAL SPONSORSHIP AGREEMENT

This Fiscal Sponsorship Agreement ("Agreement") is made by and between <u>United for a Fair Economy Good</u>

City Fund ("Sponsor"), and the Exciting New Project Advisory Committee_ ("Committee"). Friends of OccupyBoston

Sponsor is a <u>Massachusets California</u> nonprofit public benefit corporation located in <u>Boston</u>, <u>MassachusetttsSan Francisco</u>,

California, qualified as exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and classified as a public charity under IRC Sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi). The Committee is an unincorporated nonprofit association established to oversee the affairs of the Occupy Boston as Project described below.1

RECITALS

Its Sponsor's asset in accordance with Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) paragraphs ASC 958-605-25-25 and -26, formerly expressed in Statement No. 136 issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). Because the restricted fund is held under the charitable trust doctrine for the purposes of the Occupy Boston Project as understood by and with funding sources, the parties intend that assets in the restricted fund are not subject to the claims of any creditor or to legal process resulting from activities of Sponsor unrelated to the Project. 5. Performance of Charitable Purposes. All of the assets received by <u>United for a Fair Economy</u> Sponsor

under the terms of this Agreement shall be devoted to the purposes of Occupy Boston, the Project, within the

tax-exempt purposes of <u>United for a Fair Economy</u>. Expenditures for any attempt to influence legislation

within the meaning of IRC Section 501(c)(3) shall be subject to limitations imposed by United for a Fair Economy. UFE Sponsor. Sponsor shall not use any portion of the assets to participate or intervene in any

political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office, to induce or encourage violations of law or public policy, to cause any private inurement or improper private benefit to occur, nor to take any other action inconsistent with IRC Section

501(c)(3). <u>United for a Fair Economy Sponsor</u> has determined, based on the advice of tax-exempt legal counsel, that

the restricted fund is not a donor-advised fund within the meaning of IRC Section 4966(d)(2) as presently interpreted under federal tax authorities. <u>United for a Fair Economy</u> [The sponsor should have

6. Termination. This Agreement shall terminate when <u>either United for a Fair Economy or Occupy Boston Sponsor</u> determines that <u>their</u>

objectives of the <u>Occupy Boston Project</u> can still be accomplished but either the <u>Friends of Occupy Boston Committee</u> or <u>United for a Fair Economy Sponsor</u>

desires to terminate its Sponsor's fiscal sponsorship of the Occupy Boston. Project, the following understandings shall apply. Either <u>United for a Fair Economy Sponsor</u> or the <u>Friends of Occupy Boston</u> Committee may terminate this Agreement

on <u>xx</u> days' written notice to the other party, so long as another nonprofit organization acceptable to both parties³ is found that is tax-exempt under IRC Section 501(c)(3), is not classified as a private foundation under Section 509(a) (a Successor), and is willing and able to sponsor <u>Occupy Bostonthe Project</u>. assets in <u>United for a Fair Economy's Sponsor's</u> restricted fund for the <u>Occupy Boston Project</u>, together with any other tangible and

intangible assets held and liabilities incurred by <u>United for a Fair Economy Sponsor</u> in connection with <u>Occupy Boston the Project</u>,

shall be transferred to the Successor at the end of the notice period or any extension thereof, subject to the approval of any third parties that may be required. If the Committee has formed a new organization qualified to be a Successor as set forth in this Paragraph, such organization shall be eligible to receive all such assets and liabilities so long as it has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service, indicating that such qualifications have been met, no later than the end of the notice period or any extension thereof. If no Successor acceptable to both parties is found within a reasonable time, United for a Fair Economy Sponsor may dispose of Occupy Boston the Project assets and liabilities in any manner consistent with

applicable tax and charitable trust laws. Either party may terminate this Agreement, based upon a material breach of this Agreement by the other party, by giving xx___days' written notice to the other party, and any Occupy Boston Project assets and liabilities shall be disposed of at the end

of the notice period in a manner consistent with the provisions stated above in this Paragraph.

- 7. Miscellaneous. In the event of any controversy, claim, or dispute between the parties arising out of or related to this Agreement, or the alleged breach thereof, the prevailing party shall, in addition to any other relief, be entitled to recover its reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of sustaining its position. Each provision of this Agreement shall be separately enforceable, and the invalidity of one provision shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision. This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, State of California applicable to contracts to be performed
- entirely within such State. Time is of the essence of this Agreement and of each and every provision hereof. The failure of Sponsor to exercise any of its rights under this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of such rights.
- 8. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the only agreement, and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings, both written and oral, among the parties
