If the project already exists and there are assets or liabilities to be transferred in from a prior sponsor, a different form may be needed. Words in italies may need to be replaced or deleted and footnotes should be deleted. The contracting parties here are the 501(c)(3) sponsor and the project's advisory committee, which is an unincorporated association with no financial existence, but with certain rights and duties ereated by this Agreement. The committee will oversee the project under authority delegated to it by the sponsor's board. This exemplar also gives the committee a degree of "portability" whereby the committee can terminate the Agreement and take up to X days to find another sponsor willing and able to take over the project, but the current sponsor and the committee must agree on the choice. ## FISCAL SPONSORSHIP AGREEMENT

This Fiscal Sponsorship Agreement ("Agreement") is made by and between <u>United for a Fair Economy Good</u>

City Fund ("Sponsor"), and the Exciting New Project Advisory Committee\_ ("Committee"). Friends of Occupy Boston

Sponsor is a Massachusets California nonprofit public benefit corporation located in Boston.

Massachusetts San Francisco,

California, qualified as exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and classified as a public charity under IRC Sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi). The Committee is an unincorporated nonprofit association established to oversee the affairs of the Occupy Boston as Project described below.1

Its Sponsor's asset in accordance with Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) paragraphs ASC 958-605-25-25 and -26, formerly expressed in Statement No. 136 issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). Because the restricted fund is held under the charitable trust doctrine for the purposes of the Occupy Boston Project as understood by and with funding sources, the parties intend that assets in the restricted fund are not subject to the claims of any creditor or to legal process resulting from activities of UFESponsor unrelated to Occupy Bostonthe Project.

5. Performance of Charitable Purposes. All of the assets received by <u>United for a Fair Economy-Sponsor</u>

under the terms of this Agreement shall be devoted to the <u>mission purposes</u> of <u>Occupy Boston the Project</u>, within the

tax-exempt purposes of <u>United for a Fair Economy</u>. Sponsor. Expenditures for any attempt to influence legislation

within the meaning of IRC Section 501(c)(3) shall be subject to limitations imposed by United for a Fair Economy. UFE Sponsor. Sponsor shall not use any portion of the assets to participate or intervene in any

political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office, to induce or encourage violations of law or public policy, to cause any private inurement or improper private benefit to occur, nor to take any other action inconsistent with IRC Section 501(c)(3). <u>United for a Fair Economy Sponsor</u> has determined, based on the advice of tax-exempt legal counsel, that

the restricted fund is not a donor-advised fund within the meaning of IRC Section 4966(d)(2) as presently interpreted under federal tax authorities. [The sponsor should have legal counsel review the proposed arrangement and confirm the statement in the last sentence of this paragraph.]

6. Termination. This Agreement shall terminate when either United for a Fair Economy or Occupy Boston Sponsor determines that their

the objectives of the Project can no longer reasonably be accomplished through the agreement. by Sponsor. If the

objectives of the Occupy Boston Project can still be accomplished but either the Friends of Occupy Boston Committee or United for a Fair Economy Sponsor

desires to terminate <u>its Sponsor's</u> fiscal sponsorship of the <u>Occupy Boston</u>. <u>Project</u>, the following understandings shall apply. Either <u>United for a Fair Economy Sponsor</u> or the <u>Friends of Occupy Boston</u> Committee may terminate this Agreement

shall be transferred to the Successor at the end of the notice period or any extension thereof, subject to the approval of any third parties that may be required. If <u>Friends of Occupy Bostonthe-Committee</u> has

formed a new organization qualified to be a Successor as set forth in this Paragraph, such organization shall be eligible to receive all such assets and liabilities so long as it has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service, indicating that such qualifications have been met, no later than the end of the notice period or any extension thereof. If no Successor acceptable to both parties is found within a reasonable time,

<u>United for a Fair Economy Sponsor</u> may dispose of <u>Occupy Boston's the Project</u> assets and liabilities in any manner consistent with

applicable tax and charitable trust laws. Fither party may terminate this Agreement, based

applicable tax and charitable trust laws. Either party may terminate this Agreement, based upon a material breach of this Agreement by the other party, by giving <a href="mailto:xx\_">xx\_</a> days' written notice to the other party, and <a href="mailto:any-occupy-Boston's Project">any-occupy-Boston's Project</a> assets and liabilities shall be disposed of at the end

of the notice period in a manner consistent with the provisions stated above in this Paragraph.

7. Miscellaneous. In the event of any controversy, claim, or dispute between the parties arising out of or related to this Agreement, or the alleged breach thereof, the prevailing party shall, in addition to any other relief, be entitled to recover its reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of sustaining its position. Each provision of this Agreement shall be separately enforceable, and the invalidity of one provision shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision. This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts State of California applicable to contracts to be performed

entirely within such <u>Commonwealth</u>. <u>State</u>. Time is of the essence of this Agreement and of each and every

provision hereof. The failure of <u>United for a Fair EconomySponsor</u> to exercise any of its rights under this Agreement

shall not be deemed a waiver of such rights.

8. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the only agreement, and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings, both written and oral, among the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. All Exhibits hereto are a material part of this Agreement and are incorporated by reference. This Agreement, including any Exhibits hereto, may not be amended or modified, except in a writing signed by all parties to this Agreement.
